

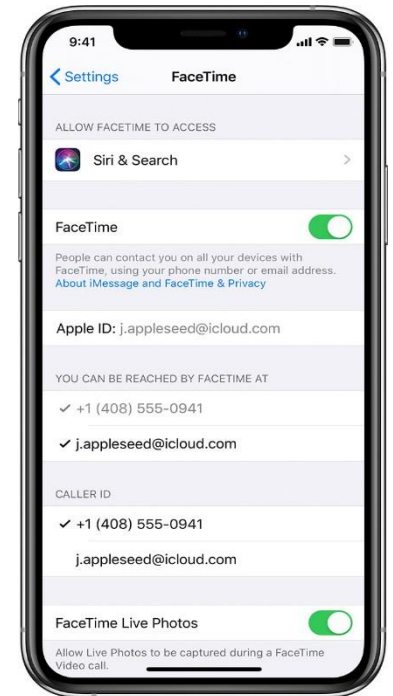
Facetime

Facetime is an apple service that allows video and audio calls to be made over Wi-Fi or a data connection. You must have an apple device in order to make and participate in these calls.

If you're using an iPhone, FaceTime automatically registers your phone number, however you can also register you email address. To do this you will need to visit your settings.

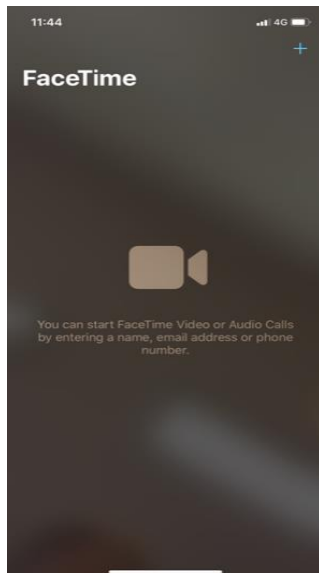
Go to Settings > FaceTime > Use your Apple ID for FaceTime, and sign in with your Apple ID.


You will need to follow this step if you are using an iPod or an iPad




How to make a call

To make a FaceTime call, you need the person's phone number or registered email address.



Open the Facetime  app

- In the FaceTime app, tap the plus button  and type the person's phone number or email address. Tap the number or address to confirm.
- If you have the person's phone number or email address saved in your contacts, you can start typing their name and tap the name to confirm when it appears.
- Click on audio or video to begin the call.



Make a Facetime call to a group

Is it possible to add up to 30 people into a Facetime call however all participants must be operating on software version 12.1

- In the FaceTime app, tap the plus button **+** and type the person's phone number or email address. Tap the number or address to confirm.
- Keep adding contacts until all the people you want to add are visible on the list
- Now tap either video or audio to initiate the call

Facetime during a normal call

- You can also start a FaceTime video call from your iPhone during a phone call.
- When the call is active, tap the FaceTime icon in the Phone screen to switch to FaceTime.
- This will alert the receiver of the call that you wish to switch to Facetime and they can choose to accept or decline
